IPS Adhesives is aware of the Methylene Chloride: Regulation Under the Toxic Substances Control Act Final Rule issued on May 8, 2024, by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). While the rule becomes effective on July 8, 2024, the early months only require manufacturers, processors, and distributors to keep all business records concerning methylene chloride. The subsequent compliance requirement begins on **February 3, 2025**, when all persons are prohibited from distributing methylene chloride-containing products to consumers and retailers, including e-commerce.

The EPA's final rule allows the use of methylene chloride for solvent welding by industrial and commercial users only, with the implementation of an extensive Workplace Chemical Protection Plan (WCPP). The WCPP consists of employee monitoring, reporting, documentation, and more extensive respiratory protection and other Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). The EPA will release guidance documents on their WCPP provisions later.

This ruling affects Weld-On® #3, #4, #4SC, and #16 and Sci-Grip® #16 acrylic solvent cements. No other IPS Adhesives or Weld-On products in North America are affected by this ruling. The applicable compliance dates are as follows:

All industrial/commercial uses other than laboratory & solvent welding	1/28/2026
